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Recognise that the word God is very important.

Explain how God sees you.

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Describe what God is like.

Explain what people of faith believe God is like and why?

Justify what you think people of faith believe and evidence you're thinking.

Make reasoned judgments about how people of faith believe God would want them to live.

Demonstrate understanding of the deity of different faiths in all its' fullness.

5 Synthesize the different characteristics of God and their impact on people of faith.

Reach informed conclusions about how people of faith can 'be saved'- Explain God's part in it.

Reach informed conclusions about what God is like people of faith as evidenced in their holy writings. Describe how people of faith believe the world was created.

Identify a significant character within a religion

Recall who people of faith believe made the world.

Sequence the events of creation.

Demonstrate understanding of why people have a faith.

Describe what hope is bought from being a person of faith.

Reach informed conclusions about how and why people try to make the world a better place.

Reach informed conclusions about the significance of key festivals.

Justify the views that are held by people of faith regarding 'being saved'.

Explain and demonstrate understanding of why sacred books are important to people of faith.

Critique what matters most to people of faith and people of no faith.

Make reasoned judgments as to why some people believe in God and others don't.

Evaluate why people of faith want to be good.

Describe a significant festival and rite of passage for people of faith.

Describe specific religious practices e.g. pray and worship.

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Summarise the key events of different festivals and explain their significance.

Recall aspects of key festivals/celebrations.

Explain their significance

Explain how festivals and family life matter to people of faith.

Empathise with people of faith and what it is like for them to follow God.

Describe and explain how and why people mark the significant events of life?

Describe and explain key events in the lives of people of a different faith.

Critique the historical and political contexts of significant religious festivals and their origin.

Describe how beliefs impact the behaviour of people of faith.

Describe what it means to belong to a faith community.

Give reasons as to how and why peoples' faith impacts their care for the world and others.

Compare and contrast how people of different faiths live their lives based on their faiths.

Explain what it is like for someone to follow God.

Evaluate what people of faith learn from the creation story.

Recall features of different faith, compare and contrast and reach informed conclusions about what it is like it be a person of faith in Britain.

Reach informed conclusions about how the characteristics of God impact the choices of people of faith.

Evaluate how faith helps people when life gets hard.

Critique the relationship between creation and Science.
