Year 3	Autumn - 'J-Apperends Le Francais' - I'm Learning French (Early Language Teaching) Use and identify the phonics learnt Pinpoint France on a map of the world Highlight other famous French cities Talk about other countries where French is spoken Say their name and how they are feeling Count to ten	Spring- 'La Animaux' - Animals (Early Language Teaching) Remember all the language from unit 1. Be introduced to ten animals. Match all the new words to the appropriate picture. Remember the words for at least five animals unaided. Attempt to spell at least three animals correctly.	Summer- 'Je Peux' I Can (Early Language Teaching) Recognise some common verbs/activities. Use these verbs to convey meaning in English by matching them to their appropriate picture. Use these verbs in the infinitive with je peux
Year 4	Autumn - 'J-Apperends Le Francais' - I'm Learning French (Early Language Teaching) (Spiral Unit) Use and identify the phonics learnt Pinpoint France on a map of the world Highlight other famous French cities Talk about other countries where French is spoken Have a simple conversation saying their name and how they are feeling Count to ten and beyond	 Spring: 'Je Me Présente' - Presenting Myself (Intermediate Language Teaching) Count to 20. Ask somebody how they are feeling, their age, name and where they live. Say how we are feeling, how old we are, what our name is and where we live. Apply rules of adjectival agreement when saying our nationality. 	Summer: 'En Classe' - Classroom (Intermediate Language Teaching) Recall from memory a selection of nouns and indefinite articles for common classroom objects. Learn how to use the negative. Describe what we have and do not have in our pencil case. Respond to simple classroom commands.
Year 5	 Autumn: 'Je Me Présente' - Presenting Myself (Intermediate Language Teaching) (Spiral Unit) Count to 20 (seeing the pattern of counting beyond) Ask somebody how they are feeling, their age, name and where they live. Say how we are feeling, how old we are, what our name is and where we live. Apply rules of adjectival agreement when saying our nationality. 	 Spring: 'La Famille' - Family (Intermediate Language Teaching) Tell somebody the members, names and various ages of either their own or a fictional family. Continue to count, with the option of reaching 100, enabling students to say the age of various family members. Understand the concept of the possessive adjectives 'mon', 'ma' and 'mes'. Move from 1st person singular to 3rd person singular of the two high frequency verbs used in this unit: s'appeler (to be called) and avoir (to have). 	Summer: 'Quelle Est La Date Aujourd'hui?' What Is The Date? (Intermediate Language Teaching) Recognise and recall the 12 months of the year. Ask what the date is and say the date. Ask somebody when their birthday is and say when their own birthday is.
Year 6	 Autumn: 'Je Me Présente' Presenting Myself (Intermediate Language Teaching) (Spiral Unit) Count to 20. Hold a conversation asking somebody how they are feeling, their age, name and where they live. Hold a conversation asking how we are feeling, how old we are, what our name is and where we live Apply rules of adjectival agreement when saying our nationality. 	 Spring 'As-tu un animal?' Do You Have A Pet? (Intermediate Language Teaching) Know the nouns and indefinite articles for 8 common pets. Ask somebody if they have a pet and give an answer back. Say what pet we have/do not have and give our pet's name. Start to use the simple connectives et (and) and mais (but) to make more complex and interesting sentences. 	 Summer 'Chez Moi' - My Home (Intermediate Language Teaching) Say and write whether we live in a house or an apartment. Say what room we have and do not have at home using the key structure chez moi il y a and chez moi in n'y a pas de/d' Use the connective/conjunction et to link two sentences together.
