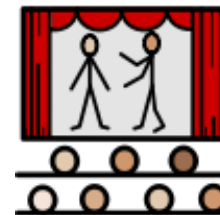

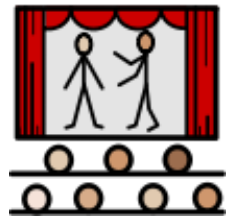
Know that the story of Exodus informs Jewish beliefs about God and his relationship with Jewish people.
