Minimum 6 hours per week per school (12 hours with both schools). May be required to do extra hours at busy times.

Both schools are looking for a new admin member to join their teams and support the work of their Governors. Candidates must have sound administration experience and be competent in the use of ICT, email and internet and have access to a suitable computer. **This post is home based** but will require an ability and willingness to visit the schools to deal with admin tasks in addition to attending meetings. You should have an interest in education, be tactful, flexible and able to deal with matters confidentially.

We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expect all staff to share this commitment. You will be required to undergo an enhanced DBS check.

Covid-19 Latest Guidance

In school, we will be continuing with measures to reduce the potential spread of Covid-19. These include staff undertaking twice weekly lateral flow testing, increased ventilation around the building and in classrooms, increased hand washing and cleaning during the school day and reduced contact between classes during the school day. We will keep these measures under review and take additional steps if necessary or in response to any outbreaks.

The guidance around self isolation has changed again this week.

Since Wednesday 22 December, the 10 day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced this week to 5 full days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason.

Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 5 and day 6 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under 5, with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion. If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to your education setting from day 6.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation. Further information is available in the <u>stay at home</u>: <u>guidance for households with possible or confirmed</u>

<u>COVID-19 infection</u>.

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Children under 5 are not being advised to take part in daily testing of close contacts. If a child under 5 is a contact of a confirmed case, they are not required to self-isolate and should not start daily testing. If they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 they should limit their contact with anyone who is at higher risk of severe illness if infected with COVID-19, and arrange to take a PCR test as soon as possible. They can continue to attend an education or childcare setting while waiting for the PCR result. If the test is positive, they should follow the <u>stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection.</u>

If a child is off school because of a positive covid test, but is feeling well with no symptoms, we will set work for them to complete while at home. However, if they are poorly, then we won't set work for them as they should focus on getting better.
